E iho ana o luna	That which is above shall be brought down
E iho ana o lalo	That which is below shall be lifted up
E hui ana na moku	The islands shall be united
E ku ana ka paia	The walls shall stand upright

## I Ku Mau Mau

(adapted from Hawaiian Antiquities by David Malo p. 186)

(Done 5 times with different alaka`i if possible)

One: I ku mau mau!	Stand up in couples!
<i>All: I ku wa!</i>	Stand at intervals!
One: I ku mau mau!	Stand in couples!
I ku huluhulu!	Haul with all your might!
I ku lanawao!	Under the mighty trees!
<i>All: I ku wa!</i>	Stand at intervals!
One: I ku lanawao!	Stand up among the tall forest trees!
<i>All: I ku wa!</i>	Stand at intervals!
<i>I ku wa! Huki!</i>	Stand at intervals! and pull!
<i>I ku wa! Ko!</i>	Stand at intervals! and haul!
<i>I ku wa a mau!</i>	Stand in place! and haul!
<i>A mau ka eulu</i>	Haul branches and all!
<i>E huki, e!</i>	Haul now!
<i>Kulia!</i>	Stand up my hearties!
